Our Digital Learning Plan

1. Introduction

This document records the outcomes of our current digital learning plan, including targets and the actions we will implement to meet the targets.

1.1 School Details:

Scoil Mhaoilíosa, is a vertical, co-educational national school. There is currently a pupil enrolment of 153. There are 9 teachers, 3 of which work in special education contexts, and two Special Needs Assistants. The school derives much of its population from the Knockavilla/Upton area and Crossbarry village. The school has a very active Parents Association called *Cairdeas* who regularly fundraise for resources including IT. Currently we have a bank of 16 laptops and 12 iPads. Each teacher has their own laptop and an Interactive Whiteboard in their classroom. Our current SSE focus is on Spelling and for the 19/20 School Year- English Comprehension. 16 new iPads and docking station alongside 8 new laptops will be purchased for the 19/20 School Year from the IT Grant and *Cairdeas* funds.

1.2 School Vision:

- **In our school we believe that digital technologies should be used for teaching, learning and assessment across the curriculum. Digital technology needs to be an integral part of teaching and learning in schools today. The management will promote a culture of collective, collaborative and reflective practice amongst staff when using digital technologies. IT is our aim that pupils will have access to current digital technologies and we will match future investment to the learning needs of the pupils.**
- **We want to use Digital Learning as an exciting, engaging and creative medium for expression whereby the pupils in our school can create meaningful digital content. We also recognise the positive impact that digital technologies can have on the learning of pupils with special and additional needs and aim to continue to harness this potential in our school.**

1.3 Brief account of the use of digital technologies in the school to date:

- *In our school to date technology is used in line with the available infrastructure. We aim to focus more on student engagement with digital technology.*
- *Pupils use apps on iPads, use technology to source information and have begun to use Book Creator. Pupil's with additional needs use the laptops for typing and apps such as Nessy for phonics, reading and spelling.*

- Parental Input e.g. helping with the VEX Robotics/ Board of Management Parent's Nominee co-ordinating the maintenance of IT in the school
- Funding available through the Board of Management and Cairdeas to purchase equipment

- Staff will engage in CPD in order to facilitate a greater use of digital technologies by pupils
- A digital technologies Teach Meet discussion will be put on the agenda for all staff meetings.
- Design activities where pupils use Book Creator to support and enhance learning in different curricular areas.
